1 *The General Assembly,*

2

3 *Noting* the efforts of the Democratic People's Republic of Korea and the Republic of Korea put forward at  
4 the third inter-Korean summit in the Inter-Korean Peace House in the Republic of Korea in 2018,

5

6 *Bearing in mind* General Assembly resolution 49/75 E on a step-by-step reduction of the nuclear threat  
7 and resolutions 70/52, 71/63, and 72/38 on nuclear disarmament,

8

9 *Reaffirming* the inalienable right of all Member States to acquire and develop nuclear energy for peaceful  
10 purposes,

11

12 *Recognizing* the urgent need to take concrete practical steps towards achieving the establishment of a  
13 world free of nuclear weapons,

14

15 *Reiterating* the highest priority attributed to nuclear disarmament in the Final Document of the Tenth  
16 Special Session of the General Assembly S-10/2, the first special session devoted to nuclear  
17 disarmament, and by the international community,

18

19 *Acknowledging* paragraph 50 of the Final Document of the Tenth Special Session of the General  
20 Assembly demanding essential negotiation at appropriate stages and with adequate measures based on  
21 common ground for the accomplishment of nuclear disarmament,

23 *Stressing* the significance and importance of the Comprehensive Nuclear Test Ban Treaty, prohibiting the  
24 conduction of nuclear tests,

26 *Having considered* the dangers and threats of nuclear weapon tests, which can be mitigated through the  
27 ratification of the Comprehensive Nuclear Test Ban Treaty by all Member States,

28

29 *Acknowledging* the importance of the Kaesong Industrial Zone as a mutually beneficial economic and  
30 bilateral project furthering the accomplishment of common ground between both Korean Member States,

32 *Calling attention to* the policy of 'No First Use', which recommends Member States to work in one  
33 direction to promote and secure peace in the long term through not initiating an armed conflict unless first  
34 attacked by an adversary,

36 *Noting also* the agreement between the Democratic People's Republic of Korea and the Republic of  
37 Korea to further the goal of a peaceful Korean peninsula,

39 1. *Encourages* the continuation of bilateral peace negotiations between the Democratic People's  
40 Republic of Korea and the Republic of Korea;

42 2. *Further encourages* the Democratic People's Republic of Korea and the Republic of Korea to not  
43 undertake any aggressive action towards each other;

- 45 3. *Asks*, for that purpose, the Republic of Korea to lift the suspension of inter-Korean trade;  
46  
47 4. *Requests* the Republic of Korea to offer sufficient and effective investments at the Kaesong Industrial  
48 Zone;  
49  
50 5. *Suggests* the Democratic People's Republic of Korea to sign and ratify the Comprehensive Nuclear  
51 Test Ban Treaty;

53 6. *Calls upon* Member States to partially lift at least four sanctions in the economic sector against the  
54 Democratic People's Republic of Korea after bilateral negotiations;

56 7. *Recommends* the United States of America following bilateral negotiations between the respective  
57 Member States to consider removing the Democratic People's Republic of Korea from the list of State  
58 Sponsors of Terrorism;

60 8. *Further recommends* the Democratic People's Republic of Korea to approve of and implement the  
61 'No First Use'-policy;

63 9. *Expresses its hope* that the Democratic People's Republic of Korea as well as the Republic of Korea  
64 continue participating in the Conference on Disarmament using it as a platform for finding common  
65 ground;

67 10. *Expresses its appreciation* on the agreement between the Democratic People's Republic of Korea  
68 and the Republic of Korea serving as an example for overcoming bilateral rivalry and by that,  
69 supporting the achievement of stability, peace and security on the global stage.
